INDIVIDUAL BIOS

Laura Dangerfield Stevens (flute) is the Instructor of Flute and Director of the Flute Ensemble at High Point University. She is the principal flutist of the Western Piedmont Symphony, holds the piccolo position with the Salisbury Symphony, and performs with many orchestras throughout the east coast. Laura is a founding member of the Relevents Wind Quintet who made their critically acclaimed debut tour through Southern Germany in April 2009. She also traveled to Venezuela, South America with the Archipelago Project to teach and perform through *El Sistema*, a youth orchestra program. Laura is pursuing Doctorate of Musical Arts Degree at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. She received the Bachelor of Music Degree from the Salem College School of Music and Master of Music Degree from the University of North Carolina School of the Arts. She lives in Winston-Salem with her husband/composer, William R. Stevens, her daughter, Satie, and their three dogs, Naima, Phaedra, and Kendra.

Thomas Pappas (oboe) is active as soloist, chamber musician, orchestral player, and teacher. He has performed throughout the United States,
Germany, France, Spain, Hungary, the Czech Republic, and Wales. Past solo appearances include performances of oboe concertos in
Greensboro, NC and with the Aalen Symphony Orchestra in Germany, where he grew up and first learned how to play the oboe. An avid
chamber musician, Pappas is a founding member of Relevents Wind Quintet. He has served as the principal oboist of the NOVUS Chamber
Orchestra, the Fibonacci Chamber Orchestra, and has performed principal and section oboe with the Greensboro, Winston-Salem, Roanoke
(VA), Salisbury and Western Piedmont symphony orchestras, and the Chamber Orchestra of the Triangle. He was a featured soloist on the
annual computer music concert xMUSE at the University of South Carolina. Other professional conferences at which he has performed include
the North American Saxophone Alliance, the Society of Composers Inc., UNCG Cello Celebrations (Silva and Varga) and the UNCG New Music
Festival. He enjoys performing new music and has premiered several works, including ones written for him by his brother, the composer
Daniel Pappas. He is also a member of the Pappas Family Recorder Quartet, who released their first commercially available CD in 2005. Pappas
is on the faculty at High Point University, Guilford Technical Community College, and Alamance Community College. Pappas holds the Bachelor
of Arts degree from Grace College, IN, the Master of Music and the Doctorate of Musical Arts degrees from the University of North Carolina at
Greensboro. Thomas resides in Greensboro with his three dogs: Bella, Delphi, and Winnie.

Shawn Copeland (clarinet) is a Florida native. An avid chamber musician, Shawn is a founding member of Relevents Wind Quintet, The Bellwood Trio and *Una Voce*. He has presented masterclasses, recitals and premiered works throughout the United States, Mexico, Germany, Ireland and Japan. He has served as the principal clarinetist of the NOVUS Chamber Orchestra, the Fibonacci Chamber Orchestra and performs with the North Carolina Symphony, the Carolina Pops, the Greensboro Symphony Orchestra and the Winston-Salem Symphony as well as many other local orchestras throughout North Carolina. He has served as second clarinetist/bass clarinetist for the Bach Festival Orchestra and

is a founding member of Southern Winds. Dr. Copeland received the Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He holds additional degrees from the University of Central Florida and Stetson University. Dr. Copeland is currently the Adjunct Professor of Clarinet at High Point University. As an accredited teacher of Alexander Technique and a specialist in the application of anatomy and physiology called Body Mapping, Shawn maintains an active teaching schedule, presenting masterclasses and lessons throughout the southern United States. He has taught at Stetson University, Coastal Carolina University, NC A&T University, Mars Hill College and University of North Carolina at Greensboro. In the summers, Dr. Copeland teachers Alexander Technique at the Eastern Music Festival and Clarinet at the Stetson University Summer Clarinet Clinic. Shawn resides in Greensboro, NC with his Jack Russell Terrier, Scribble.

A Michigan native, Mark Hekman (bassoon) has fallen in love with the climate of North Carolina. He has spent most of his life in cold places, completing his Bachelor of Music degree at Ithaca College with Lee Goodhew and his Master of Music degree at The Ohio State University with Chris Weaitt.
